

Report on Swachhata Pakhwada (15th September 2025 to 9th October 2025)

1. Plantation Drive

3. Cleanliness Drive – “Ek Din, Ek Ghanta, Ek Saath” : 25th September 2025

Phase 1 – 50 Participants

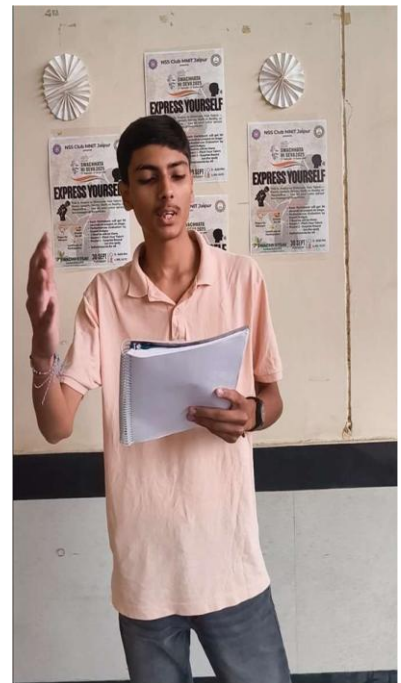
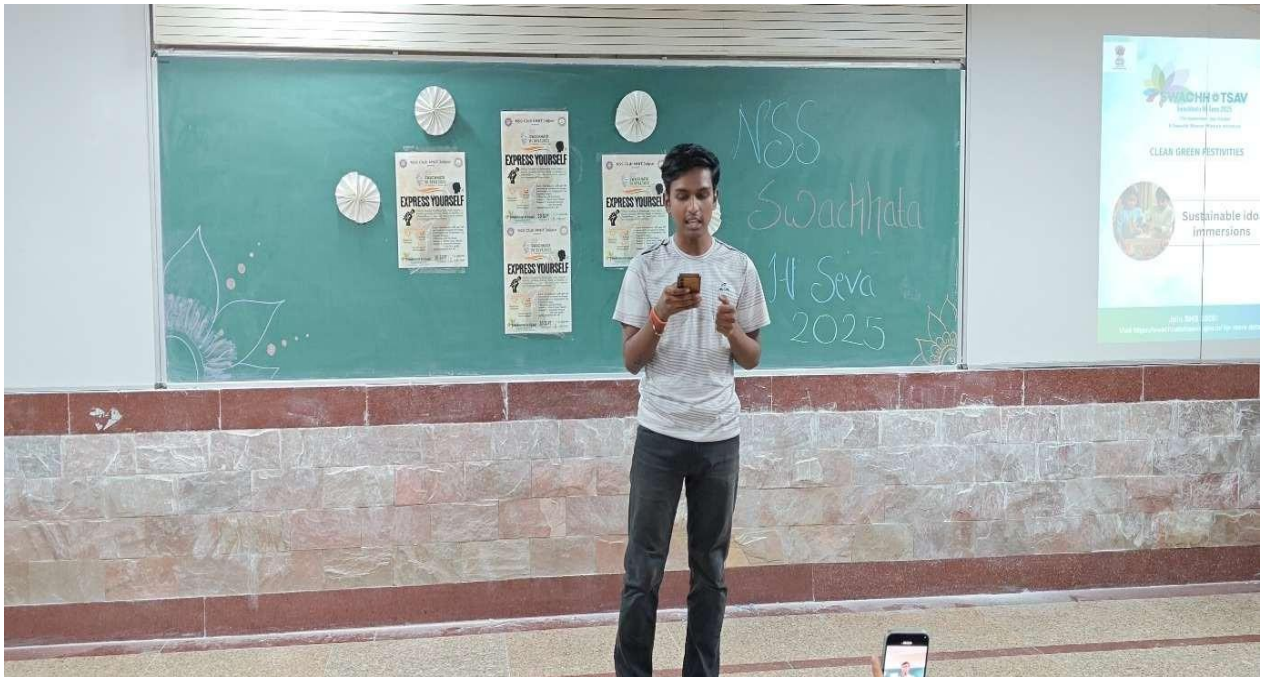


Phase 2 – 30 Participants

From both the phases of first round, 8 participants were shortlisted for the final round. In this round, participants showcased their creativity through presentations, poems, speeches, and even rap performances, all centred around the theme of Cleanliness and Civic Responsibility.

The diversity of ideas and styles highlighted the awareness, talent, and social sensitivity among MNIT students.
