The deliberations will address key themes such as gendered social norms, lack of social capital, access to financial resources, learning environments, the role of families and the importance communities, and mentorship and role models in shaping STEM career aspirations.

Through interactive sessions and discussions, the workshop will contribute towards generating practical, context-sensitive, evidence-based recommendations to advance gender parity in STEM education. The workshop aims to bridge the gap between policy intent and real-world implementation and practice, fostering a more inclusive and supportive STEM environment for learners in marginalized rural communities.
