- 3. **Eligibility:** Open to both **MNIT students** and **external participants** (from other colleges or independent filmmakers).
- 4. Originality: All submissions had to be original works, and plagiarism was strictly prohibited.
- 5. **Language:** Films could be made in any language but required English subtitles if not in Hindi or English.
- 6. **Technical Quality:** Films were judged on their **storyline**, **cinematography**, **editing**, **sound design**, and **overall impact**.
