The presentation started with a discussion on the current Russia- Ukraine conflict and its effect on geopolitics vis-à-vis India. The presenter explained that Budget is the estimate of receipt and expenditure of the Government and it falls under Article 112, of the Indian constitution. Mr.

Chauhan highlighted that the government's expenditure was on the higher side, because of the pandemic. Although, he emphasized that this year's budget was a balanced one.





The presenter threw light on some data which were part of the Budget 2022-23. The Fiscal deficit is projected at 6.9% of the GDP this year and it might overshoot even more due to various sanctions imposed on Russia, amidst conflict on the border. The schemes in focus for this fiscal year are- PM Gati Shakti, Inclusive Development, Climate Change, Energy Transition, and Financing in Investments. The government is also focusing on skill development for better employment opportunities and the development of MSMEs. The government is determined to develop infrastructure like roads and railways. However, few reductions were imposed in sectors such as education and health. These are the few loopholes in the Budget, which Mr. Chauhan highlighted. The scholar's all-inclusive presentation prompted many queries and suggestions, which led to an active discussion among the scholars and the faculty members.

The activity concluded with a token of thanks by the HUM PALS team to the presenter.
